



# YEMEN Moving up the trade facilitation ladder towards seamless international supply chains

[Cumulative implementation scores of core groups of measures; full implementation =100]



The level of implementation of trade facilitation measures in Yemen (44.1%) is below the level in West Asia (48.4%). Among the five core groups of trade facilitation measures, the most implemented in Jordan are "Transparency" measures (73.3%). The least implemented are "Crossborder paperless trade" measures (11.1%). "Transit" measures are adequately implemented (66.7%).

Implementation of "Formalities" measures is slightly above the regional average. The least implemented measures in this area are *Post-clearance audit* and *TF measures for authorized operators*. Implementation of improved "Institutional arrangement and cooperation" is above the regional average. All measures in this area stand at 66.7%

In "Paperless trade", Yemen's implementation is below West Asia averages. Measures such as, *E-application for Customs refunds, E-Payment of duties, E-preferential certificate of origin, E-Trade licenses* and *E-Single window*, have not been put in place yet.

Yemen may focus its trade facilitation efforts in particular on full implementation of "Paperless Trade" measures, as well as on moving towards "Cross-border paperless trade".
